Escondido Fire Administration: Penal Code Section 148.4. (a) Any person who does any of the following is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is punishable by imprisonment in a county jail, not exceeding one year, or by a fine, not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or by both that fine and imprisonment:

(1) Willfully and maliciously tampers with, molests, injures, or breaks any fire protection equipment, fire protection installation, fire alarm apparatus, wire, or signal.

Escondido's Heritage: The San Diego Zoological Society became interested in developing a wild animal park in 1964. The major objective of the San Diego Wild Animal Park was to provide an opportunity for endangered and near-extinct species of animals to survive and reproduce. The development proposed for the San Pasqual site would differ significantly from that of a typical zoo in that animals will be exhibited in a natural environment rather than in cages or moated enclosures. On May 14, 1969 ground was broken at the San Pasqual Wild Animal Park which now called the San Diego Wild Animal Park. May 10, 1972 marked the opening day for the San Diego Wild Animal Park. Visitors first entered the park through the world's largest free-flight aviary. There was an hour long ride on the Wgasa Bush line monorail that would take visitors through five major exhibit areas: East, South, and North Africa, Asian Plains, and Asian Swamps.
